Minutes

On a motion made by Ms. Hill and seconded by Mr. Zirkin, the Board approved the minutes of the December 21, 2010 open session meeting.

Executive Director's Report 2. Mr. R. Dean Kenderdine reported on recent Agency developments.

Mr. Kenderdine reported on the December 21, 2010 Sustainability Commission's recommendations to the Governor and the Legislative leadership. The Commission established two goals for pension reform achieving actuarial funding levels of 80% within 10 years and 100% within 30 years for the State Retirement and Pension System (SRPS). The recommendations also include:

- > For new and nonvested members, increasing the vesting requirement for all SRPS plans from 5 to 10 years.
- For new and nonvested members, eligibility for a normal service retirement in TPS/EPS should be age 62 with at least 10 years of service or a combination of age and years of service adding to 92 (the Rule of 92). Concurrently, eligibility for early retirement should be age 57 with at least 20 years of service.
- For members of the State Police Retirement System and the Law Enforcement Officers Pension System not currently enrolled in the Deferred Retirement Option Program (DROP), the program should be modified to provide 4% compounded annual interest on DROP account balances instead of the current 6% compounded monthly interest. The commission further recommends that the State explore, through the collective bargaining process, requiring members of the State Police Retirement System to hold a referendum on whether to join Social Security.
- The Commission recommends that the General Assembly Compensation Commission and the Joint Committee on Pensions study the benefit structures provided under the Legislative Pension Plan and the Judges' Retirement System, respectively, and recommend any

necessary changes to the General Assembly and Judicial Compensation Commission.

Major Krome expressed his concern that the Sustainability Commission's recommendations did not include any recommendations to eliminate corridor funding. There was no specific mention, or recommendations, made as a result of the Board's funding methodology study. Mr. Zollicoffer agreed.

Mr. Kenderdine clarified that the Commission report does refer to the Board's funding methodology recommendations which include a 10-year phase out of corridor. However, the Commission report advises against the Board's recommendations as they 1) would increase employer contributions over the next few years and, 2) would not achieve the Commission's stated goal of 80% funding of the System within 10 years.

Treasurer Kopp emphasized the fact that the Commission has not recommended consideration of a defined contribution option but rather is focused on reforms that would preserve the State's defined benefit plan.

Mr. Kenderdine reported that the committee established to review the CIO Executive Search Firm proposals has completed its work and will make its recommendation in closed session.

CIO Report

3. Dr. A. Melissa Moye reported on the portfolio's performance. She reported the preliminary unaudited results as of December 31, 2010 report assets in the trust total \$35.99 billion. The net calendar year return was 12.2%, which was 80 basis points above the policy benchmark. The fiscal year-to-date return was 14.3%.

Medical Board And Supplemental Medical Board Reports 4. On a motion made by Mr. Hughes and seconded by Major Krome, the Board of Trustees accepted all the reports of the Medical Board in connection with applications of members for ordinary, accidental and special disability retirement allowances. The Medical Board's conclusions were reached after its review of the documentation in the file.
